BUSY WEEKEND FOR EWA GYMNASTS

ALLEN, TX: It was another busy weekend for athletes from Eagle's Wings Athletics as they traveled near and far to perform their skills, impress judges, and outscore their competitors.

The Texas Amateur Athletic Federation (TAAF) team competed in the Sky High meet in The Colony February 21-22. Level 8 Kelsey Pence was the vault champion with a score of 9.3. She earned silver medals on floor exercise (9.0) and uneven parallel bars (8.2), and bronze on balance beam (7.775) to place second all-around (34.275). She also earned a second place team trophy.

The Level 5 team had several gymnasts advance, and earned 11 medals. In division 2, Lauren Sedillo placed third on beam (9.025). Alyssa Burke, division 3, scored 8.5 on

vault, earning a silver medal. Jenna Wicker was the balance beam champion for division 4 and advanced to division 3. In division 5, Allison Dutcher took first on floor (9.55), second on beam (8.525), and third on bars (7.9) to earn silver all-around (33.225) and advanced to division 3. Miranda Jones also advanced to division 3 and won in third all-around (33.15), having earned second on bars (8.45) and third on beam (8.5). Morgan Scott advanced to division 4, and Kayla Spillman to division 5 after taking second on beam (8.85) in division 6.

Several Level 4 gymnasts competed for achievement ribbons. Of the EWA team, Rachel Johnston had the highest all-around score (38.05) as well as the highest scores on floor (9.6), bars (9.4), and beam (9.35), and the second highest on vault (9.7). The highest score on vault went to Isabelle Muirhead who earned a 9.8. She also had the second highest score on floor (9.55) and all-around (35.95). Allison Moring, with the third highest all-around (35.05), earned third on three events, tying on vault with Alyssa Wilson. Haley Rose Benter has the second highest beam score (8.6) and the entire team contributed to a third place team award.
