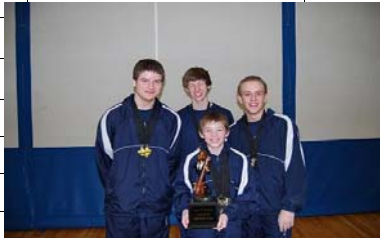

This is also where we will have Regionals, which is why we went in the first place to "scope" it out - similar to going to the Star Center meet with the L6-8s to prepare them for the State Meet.

Anyway, the Level 9 & 10s had a few teams to compete against, and they did well. The boys really learned that "less is more" regarding getting higher scores at times. They saw it's only worth competing bigger difficulty/valued skills if the skills are done in a clean manner and of course without falling. They each had "watered-down" routines at times, but still scored better than they did before at times, and they even placed or won with those routines. So, next week the boys will try and continue the trend to be simple and clean, but naturally if they attain a bigger skill that they can safely and effectively compete to be worth it, then they will. They are working towards scoring the needed all-around score at Regionals to get to Nationals, which some have done, and others are on track to accomplishing. (The official qualifying scores are not out yet. We are going based on last year's qualifying scores for now, which is 72 for Level 9, 75 for 14-15 year old Level 10s, and 76.5 for 16-18 year old Level 10s. There are other ways to qualify that I'll explain in the future).
